# Health and safety policy statement

The Evergreen 2000 Trust is a registered charity (number 1077848) dedicated to the conservation and protection of the natural environment.

We are affiliated to the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers (BTCV) and endeavour to follow the health and safety practice recommended by BTCV in all our activities.

The Evergreen 2000 Trust has insurance cover under the BTCV Combined Policy for Conservation Groups underwritten by Zurich Insurance. The public liability limit of this policy is £10 million.

Our statement of general policy is

- To provide adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from our activities
- To consult with our volunteers and contractors on matters affecting health and safety
- To provide and maintain safe equipment
- To take reasonable steps to ensure safe handling of potentially hazardous materials
- To provide information and supervision for volunteers
- To ensure all volunteers are competent to do their tasks
- To prevent accidents and cases of ill-health related to our activities
- To maintain safe and healthy working conditions
- To review this policy as necessary at regular intervals
- To take reasonable steps to leave a work site in a safe state.
